## AVENUE OF LIFE PROGRAMS

## **EQUIPPING CENTER**

The Equipping Center Program provides a comprehensive range of programs and services designed to meet the emotional, mental, physical, and spiritual needs of Wyandotte County families and individuals. The Equipping Center serves hot meals, food pantry items, hygiene products, clothing, diapers, and provides classes such as GED and ESL.

#### Program Highlights:

- Served 6,280 unduplicated individuals
- Processed and distributed \$533,949 worth of inkind donations
- Distributed 9,232 family food packs
- Distributed 2,082 frozen meals
- Distributed 39,584 Hygiene items
- Served 16,900+ hot meals
- Distributed clothing to 5,122 individuals
- Provided Christmas gifts to 134 households representing 269 children

### **BUSINESS TRAINING CENTER**

The Business Training Center hosts innovative initiatives to provide job-training to low-income and reentry men with barriers to employment.

#### Program Highlights:

- Delivered furniture to 348 at-risk households.
- Recycled 71,400 mattresses, diverting over 3,500 tons from local landfills



Impact KCK serves Wyandotte County McKinney-Vento children, youth, and families. The Impact KCK model is based on the Collective Impact model for community change. Avenue of Life is the backbone agency and coordinates the efforts of more than 90 partnering organizations committed to addressing the needs of homeless students and families. Impact KCK provides services which include intensive case management and housing solutions.

#### Program Highlights:

- Served 2,174 households with essential services such as housing, utilities, classes, and food
- Provided intensive case management to 842 households
- Served all 4 Wyandotte County school districts
- Impact KCK's Navigator housed at Wyandotte High School provided intensive case management to 89 youth and hosted 17 Harvesters distributions
- The Impact KCK model is being replicated in KCPS, will be called KCPS Empowerment Program, and Avenue of Life will be the backbone agency.

## **AVENUE YOUTH HOUSE**

The Avenue Youth House is a partnership with Our Spot KC and Avenue of Life. It has 14 bedrooms and serves at-risk youth and young adults between the ages of 18-24 with emergency shelter, a transitional living program, and a full set of wrap-around services that make it possible for homeless youth to be safe, complete their high school education, and make a successful transition into adulthood. The home provides a safe space for LGBTQ+ youth.

#### Program Highlights:

• Served 31 youth, ages 18-24 in 2022
